**Sub: Length of National Highways within Municipal limits – furnishing of information reg.**


Sir,

As per existing policy, the entire National Highways network including those which falls within the municipal limits vests with the Central Govt. However, some of the sections of National Highways within Municipal limits are still being maintained/managed by the local municipality/municipal corporations. In this connection, Ministry is in the process of preparing Policy Paper of that portion of National Highways which lies within the periphery of Municipal Limits.

2. It is requested that details of the above National Highways giving length, carriageway width, ROW, Municipal Agency, any other details information, etc. may be furnished to this office for onward submission to the Ministry.
